## Pinecone Christmas Tree Craft

Feeling crafty this holiday season? Pinecones can be used in so many crafts, and are in abundance in the Northwoods! Here's a great Christmas Tree Craft we found via Pinterest that combines pinecones and wine corks, two pretty great things!

### Supplies:

Pinecones  
Green Spray Paint  
(or green paint and brush)  
Wine corks  
(and maybe a glass of wine too!) *Adapted from babble.com*  
Scissors  
Hot glue gun  
Miniature wooden stars (or make some from cardboard)



### Directions:

1. Paint the outer edges of the pinecone. Make it look like a real tree by leaving the inside brown. Let paint dry.
2. Cut a wine cork in half and hot glue it to the bottom of the pinecone. Let glue dry.
3. Hot glue the star to the top and let dry. Use different size pinecones, or adding glitter or little pompoms too!

## Recipe Corner

### Leftover Turkey Sandwich

#### Ingredients:

4 slices Sourdough bread  
8 oz. Turkey  
4 slices Brie cheese  
1/4 cup Walnuts, chopped  
1/4 cup Raspberry Jalapeno Jam  
1 Tbsp. Butter



#### Directions:

On two slices of sourdough bread: layer brie cheese, chopped walnuts, turkey, and Raspberry Jalapeno Jam. Top with remaining two slices of bread. Lightly press together. Melt half the butter in skillet over low heat. Grill until golden on one side, turn, add remaining butter and continue cooking until sandwich is warmed throughout and golden on both sides.
