## **Student Wood Shop Projects**

Each year we are excited to work with the Tomahawk High School Wood Shop students. After the first few months of owning Cabin Creations, we realized there was a need for reasonably priced cribbage boards. Having just left the Tomahawk School District, Kristen thought of collaborating with her former colleagues and students. Four years later, the partnership still stands. The students in each of the classes work in groups to create marketable wood items for the cabin or rustic setting. They vote on their favorite projects and then submit them to us. We then choose the items we are interested in purchasing. Originally, the projects were all cribbage boards, but have since expanded to shelves, wall hangings, candle holders, and more. Students have to figure the measurements, cost of materials, and wholesale pricing. After approval, the students produce the projects.

We pay for the finished products, which means there is no cost to the program. It's a great opportunity for the students to learn about the production, pricing, and marketability of wood items, while allowing us the opportunity to get some pretty neat projects to sell at our store!
